LOW COST SPAY/ NEUTER CERTIFICATE PROGRAM

ADMINISTERED BY THE STATEN ISLAND COUNCIL FOR ANIMAL WELFARE, INC.

PAY LESS THAN HALF the price normally charged. Please, do not allow your pet or the strays you feed to reproduce. Millions of innocent pets are put to death each year. Their crime: simply being born. Cost of certificate includes surgery and anesthesia. Vaccinations and/or medications are NOT included. Some vets also charge for office visits. There is an additional charge for dogs over 50lbs, for pregnant animals, for animals in heat, and for animals with medical complications. Certificates are good for sixty (60) days. They are non-refundable. It takes 2 weeks to get certificate. Certificate should not be sent for until animal is 4 months old. For further information call 718-356-2334.

PLEASE CALL VETERINARIANS FOR ANY EXTRA CHARGES. PLEASE DO NOT MAKE APPOINTMENT UNTIL YOU RECEIVE THE CERTIFICATE(S).






