Why You Should Not Let The Cat Out!

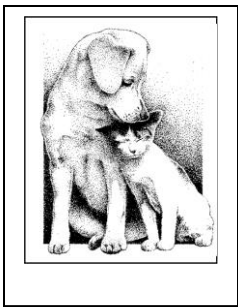
Cats that live indoors have longer, healthier lives than those who are allowed to roam the streets. An indoor cat never faces the dozens of dangers waiting outside your front door -- like cars, exposure to parasites and toxic chemicals, sickness or death from eating spoiled food or poison, and other cats ready to fight for love or territory.

Outdoor cats are in need of veterinary care a lot more often than those who live indoors, and that means higher vet bills. They are at risk of contracting serious diseases such as FIV, feline leukemia and rabies. Fleas, ticks, worms, abscesses, cuts, diarrhea and weight loss are also signs of trouble, and are most often seen in outdoor cats.

A cat allowed to go outside can easily get lost and may have difficulty finding its way back home. There is nothing more heartbreaking than wondering if your missing pet is alive or dead, or is starving and suffering on the streets.

Cats raised indoors are perfectly content with their world. They are safe from the many hazards lurking outside and enjoy close relationships with their owners. Those who have experienced the outdoors usually need some time to adjust to their new life, but eventually will learn to appreciate the comforts of home!

BORN TO DIE



There are more than 70 million homeless cats and dogs in our country. And nearly 20 million are put to death each year because there are simply not enough homes for all of them. Sadly, many pets are abandoned to an uncertain fate when their owners lose their homes. Responsible pet lovers can help stop this tragic loss of life by spaying or neutering their pets. As anyone who is feeding multiple strays knows, it would be far cheaper to neuter once than to feed the generations that are sure to follow. Left outside to breed, a pair of cats and their kittens can produce 420,000 cats in seven years! The time has come to wage an all-out war against uncontrolled animal overpopulation on Staten Island. Please support our Spay/Neuter Fund. Let's break the vicious cycle of unwanted births, unspeakable suffering, and the ultimate destruction of innumerable innocent animals whose only crime was to be born into a world in which there was no place for them.

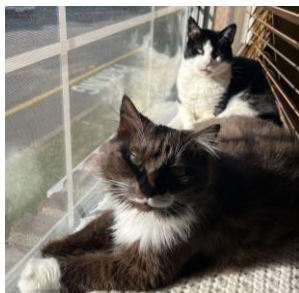

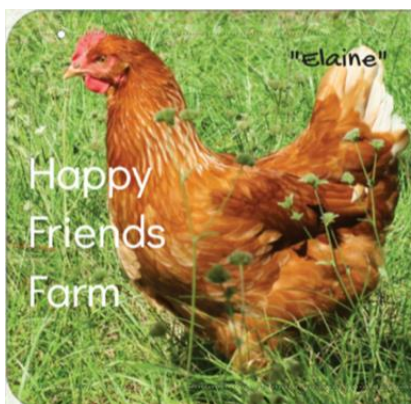
